From the simplicity of the 100-year-old Blériot Model XI to the complex flight deck of the Space Shuttle *Columbia*, Museum visitors can get a pilot's-eye view of some of the world's most significant aircraft and space vehicles through 22 large-format images of the most famous cockpits in aviation and space flight history!

Measuring approximately 4 by 7 feet, the images depict in rich and precise detail the evolution of the controls, instruments and displays used to fly a variety of significant airplanes and spacecraft.
