

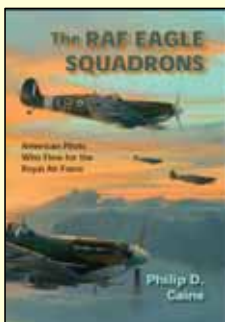
BEAT THE HEAT SATURDAY celebrates the 65th Anniversary of V-J Day – August 14, 1945

Unique displays and demonstrations relative to the history of World War II courtesy of collectors, re-enactors and the DFW GI Joe Club.

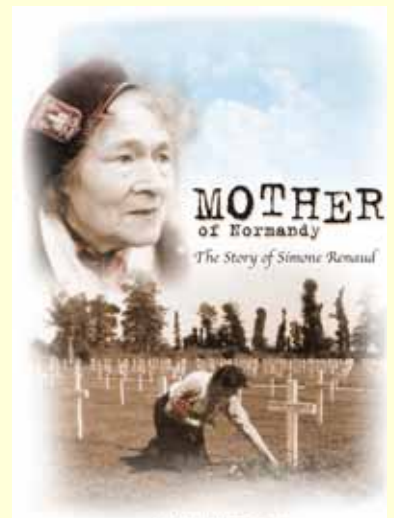
The opportunity to videotape your own V-J Day remembrances for the Museum’s archives courtesy of oral historian Chuck Hodge.

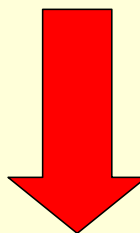
Distinguished author, lecturer and historian Brig. Gen. Philip D Caine, USAF (Ret.), speaks about his latest book, *The RAF EAGLE SQUADRONS: American Pilots who Flew for the Royal Air Force* at 1:00 p.m. Gen. Caine will also be available to sign his book in the Cree Main Exhibit Gallery before and after his remarks.

At 11:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m., producer and director Doug Stebleton presents the Dallas premier of his remarkable documentary film, *Mother of Normandy*, the little-known story of Madame Simone Renaud, wife of the Mayor of St. Mère-Église—the first town liberated in the D-Day invasion. Mme. Renaud spent a lifetime honoring the American soldiers who liberated her town by tending to their graves and corresponding with their loved ones back home.

Oral Historian Chuck Hodge will be available throughout the day to record your remembrances of August 14, 1945. These recordings will become a permanent part of the Frontiers of Flight Museum Archives, available to future students, researchers and interested visitors.

Chuck Hodge has been a volunteer oral historian for the National Museum of the Pacific War in Fredericksburg, Texas (also known as the Admiral Nimitz Museum) for the past 5 years and has conducted over 400 interviews. He also coordinates the meetings of the Happy Warriors, a group of military veterans who meet monthly at the Frontiers of Flight Museum.

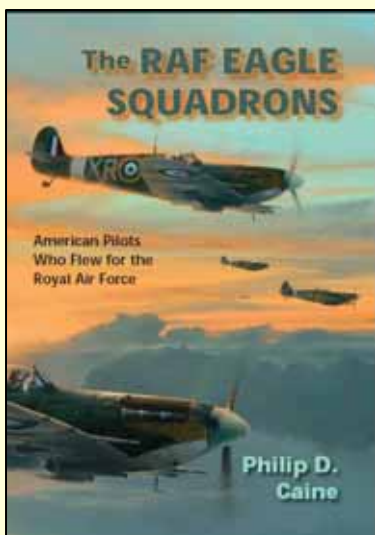
***RAF EAGLE SQUADRONS:
American Pilots who Flew for the
Royal Air Force***



In the Hamilton Family Auditorium, August 14, 2010 at 1:00 p.m.

Brigadier General Philip D. Caine was commissioned as a Distinguished Military Graduate from Air Force ROTC and subsequently graduated at the top of his pilot training class. During a 37-year Air Force career he flew some 5,000 hours in various military aircraft, and earned both his Master's Degree and Ph.D. in History from Stanford University.

General Caine drew extensively on his knowledge of history during assignments as a tenure professor and acting head of the Air Force Academy History Department, and also as acting head of a classified Vietnam-era project to document Air Force experiences in the Southeast Asian air campaign. He also served as Professor of Strategic Studies at the National War College, Senior Research Fellow at the National Defense University, and Deputy Commandant of Cadets for Military Instruction at the Air Force Academy. He retired from the Air Force in 1992 and lives with his wife, Doris, in Monument, Colorado.



General Caine's latest book includes a biographical sketch of each of the 245 members of the Eagle Squadrons. He is also the author of four other books: *Eagles of the RAF*, *American Pilots in the RAF* (the definitive history of the RAF Eagle Squadrons), *Spitfires*, *Thunderbolts and Warm Beer* (the story of an American fighter pilot's life in the RAF and Eighth Air Force), and *Aircraft Down!* (an account of six extraordinary evasion adventures during World War II in Europe).

General Caine will be available to sign copies of his book both before and after his presentation.

MOTHER OF NORMANDY

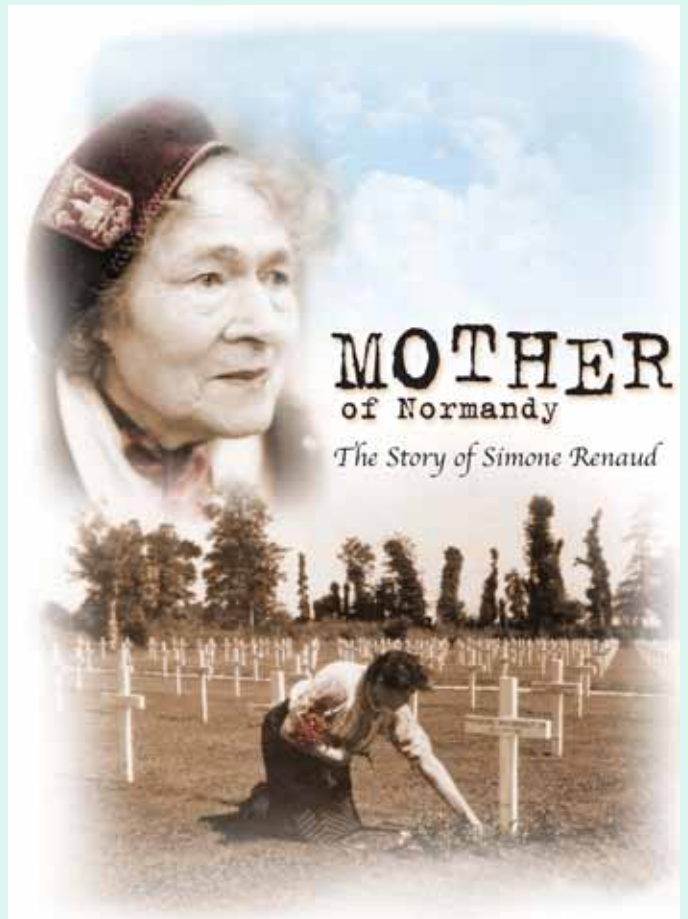
The story of one remarkable woman whose devotion to a generation of heroes transcended all boundaries.

Madame Simone Renaud witnessed the liberation of France on June 6, 1944 from a unique vantage point: the small town of St. Mère-Église, the first town liberated in the D-Day invasion and the drop point for the U.S. Army's 82nd and 101st Airborne Divisions.

It was here that she, along with her three young sons and husband, the mayor of St. Mère-Église, watched the triumph and tragedy unfold during a day that defined history. And it was here that so many American soldiers, who gave their lives to protect freedom and democracy, found their final resting place.

Mme. Renaud spent a lifetime tending to the graves of those American soldiers and corresponding with their loved ones back home. She became friend, family and touchstone to those whose lives were forever changed by D-Day.

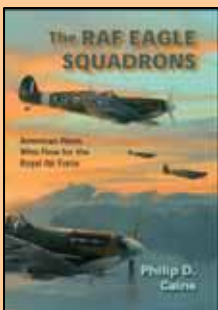
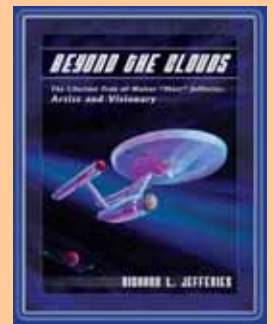


COL. RICH GRAHAM, USAF (Ret.)
