



History Museum Explorers Patch

The Frontiers of Flight Museum (FOFM) is part of the History *Museum Explorers* Progressive Patch series that includes eight history museums in the Dallas Area. This Patch may be earned by Girl Scouts in all program age levels and from any Girl Scout Council.

- **Daisies** must complete the three starred activities.
- **Brownies** must complete four activities including the three starred activities.
- **Juniors** must complete five of the following activities including the three starred activities.
- **Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors** must complete six of the following activities including the three starred activities.

*1. Visit the Museum and either complete a FOFM Scavenger Hunt or take a guided tour.

*2. Name the exhibit that was the most interesting to you and tell why.

- *3a. **Daisies** and **Brownies**: Whose picture is found in the lower right corner of the WASP poster in the World War II exhibit? Who created it?
- b. **Juniors**: In the Golden Age exhibit, find the lighted map and trace the routes in pink flown by a female pilot. Tell who she was and why the flights were significant. Juniors must complete both A and B.
- c. **Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors**: In the Golden Age exhibit, name the organization specifically founded for women aviatrices. Name the founders. Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors must complete A, B, and C.

4. Many museums have art galleries. FOFM has its own art gallery located on the second level (Browning Gallery). What was being displayed on your visit?

5. Select an aircraft from the Museum's collection and research it. Find out when it was built and who flew it. Identify some interesting features of the airplane.

6. Choose a pilot found in a Museum exhibit. Write a biography of that pilot. Tell why he/she was famous and their contribution to aviation.

7. Choose an aviation career you might like to pursue. What education requirements are necessary to obtain the chosen career?

8. Name the full-sized spacecraft housed in the Museum. What was your impression of the living quarters?
