The Museum is looking for enthusiastic part-time Program Educators who enjoy teaching an array of STEM subjects. Program Educators are responsible for delivering the Museum's high quality educational content via engaging classroom/auditorium programming and SPOC, our portable planetarium system. Programs are offered both at the Museum and offsite in schools and throughout the community.

Candidates will also be invited to fill our Part-Time Camp Educator positions for the summer. The camp sessions are weekly themed daytime camps, ranging from 1<sup>st</sup> grade to 10<sup>th</sup> grade. Camp educators will participate in a day of staff training prior to the start of camp and will report to the Education Programs Manager. Camp educators will use existing activities and curriculum with the ability to modify as needed. Summer Camp Educators must be available to work Monday-Friday on selected weeks starting on June 14, 2021 through July 30, 2021 from 8:00am-4:00pm daily.
